## Plant Protection Products (Sustainable Use) Regulations 2012 (SI 2012 No. 1657)

These Regulations implement **Directive 2009/128/EC** in the UK. They implement a legal framework for the sustainable use of pesticides taking into account preventative and precautionary principles.

The key requirements include:

- Regulation 3 Secretary of State must review the operational effect of the Regulations in England and Wales and publish a report within five years after they become law and within every five years thereafter.
- Regulations 5 and 6 the UK Competent Authority (UKCA) must designate bodies to implement certification schemes for training and bodies that have responsibility for implementing inspection schemes.
- Regulation 8 prohibits use of plant protection products (PPPs) for professional use unless the
  user holds a relevant certificate or works under supervision.
- Regulation 9 distributors which sell to end users must have sufficient staff who hold specified
  certificates to provide advice at the point of sale.
- Regulation 10 all reasonable precautions must be taken to protect human health and the environment when using PPPs.
- Regulations 11 to 14 requirements for the inspection of PPP equipment.
- Regulations 15 and 16 prohibit aerial spraying unless permitted by an aerial spraying permit.
- **Regulation 17** reasonable precautions to be taken in storing, handling and mixing PPPs and related activities.
- Regulation 18 enables UKCA to issue codes of practice.
- Regulation 24 makes it a criminal offence to contravene or fail to comply with regulations 8, 17, 22, 23 and 31.
- Regulation 28 states penalties for offences.
